

# **AUDITION INFORMATION & REQUIREMENTS 2019-20 SEASON**

Audition requirements for all ensembles include a minimum of (2) years playing the auditioning instrument

**Placement Philosophy:** After hearing auditions in late spring, the EYSO artistic staff thoughtfully makes placement decisions based together on playing ability, age, and the current needs of each ensemble. Students are ranked by audition and placed in the ensemble most closely matching their musical level, including quality of tone production, technical facility, range on the instrument, intonation, vibrato, dynamic range, articulation, phrasing, rhythmic integrity, expressive style, and overall accuracy. Meeting the printed requirements of an orchestra does not guarantee placement.

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### **AUDITION APPLICATION**

**EYSO audition applications and scheduling are online at EYSO.org.** Applications will be accepted beginning on February 1, 2019. After submitting an online application to audition, you will be able to select a specific audition time. There is a \$35 audition fee for current EYSO members and a \$45 audition fee for non-EYSO members. **All audition fees are due when the application to audition is submitted and are non-refundable.** 

#### WHAT TO PREPARE

#### 1. SOLO REPERTOIRE

**Primo, Prelude, Sinfonia & Philharmonia <u>STRINSG</u> candidates,** prepare (1) piece of solo repertoire (this should be your most well prepared and polished piece to date).

Youth Symphony STRINGS, WIND & BRASS, Sinfonia & Philharmonia WIND & BRASS candidates prepare (2) contrasting selections totaling 2-3 minutes: one should be faster and more technical in nature to demonstrate your facility on the instrument and the other should be slower and more lyrical to illustrate your musicality and expressivity.

**All candidates**, selections may include solo literature, etudes, or appropriate orchestral excerpts (if the two selections are from the same concerto, two different movements are suggested). Please choose selections carefully with guidance from your private instructor, to show the full range of your ability. Selections beyond or beneath your skill level will not enhance your audition results. Selections do not need to be memorized. No accompanist is required.

Please bring (2) photocopies of each piece for the adjudicators' reference.

## 2. EXCERPTS

**Primo, Prelude, Sinfonia & Philharmonia** <u>STRINGS</u> <u>candidates</u>, also prepare the <u>required excerpt</u>. Excerpts are available on EYSO.org beginning February 1, 2019 and are listed by instrument for each ensemble. Please prepare the required excerpts carefully with guidance from your private instructor.

## 3. SCALES

Every audition will include a demonstration of your knowledge of scales. For specific information, see the requirements on the following page.

#### 4. Sight reading

Every audition will include several appropriate-level sight-reading examples.

Percussion Requirements Sinfonia, Philharmonia, Youth Symphony Please prepare all of the following: 1. Snare solo 2. Mallet solo 3. All major/minor scales, 2 octaves, by memory preferred 4. Timpani solo (2, 3, or 4 timpani). You will be asked to tune the timpani. Xylophone, marimba, or vibes are provided. Students must bring their own mallets and may bring their own snare. Piano experience is a plus.
