### **ACTION!!**

Welcome to an evening of movie music and magic: EYSO's Night at the Movies! In this, our first-ever performance at the historic Arcada Theatre,

members of EYSO's flagship Youth Symphony bring you thrills and adventure, drama and pathos, suspense and triumph—and all with the excellence and artistry that is the hallmark of EYSO. Whether you're a long-time listener or joining us for the first time this evening, we can't wait to share our stories with you.

Have you ever watched a movie without the music? The difference is palpable: the emotional heights and depths are flattened, the tension and suspense diminished, and the overall impact seems to just...miss. Filmmakers and composers are experts at using musical devices to dictate our emotional landscape, both in obvious and subtle ways. It's impossible to get the same emotional impact and narrative journey from a movie without the music that was—in many cases—written as an integral part of the storytelling.

But amazingly, the inverse isn't true. Hearing the music, even without its film, can still draw those powerful affective connections to the stories—whether or not you're familiar with the movie it was composed to accompany. Haven't yet gotten around to watching all eleven hours of the Lord of the Rings trilogy? You'll still hear the thrill of adventure, the ominous darkness on the horizon, the joy of friendship, the heartbreak of loss, and the eventual triumph of good over evil. Didn't catch Casablanca when it first came out in 1942? The magic of motion pictures is immediately implicated through the music, as is the setting and overall narrative arc. You might not immediately recognize all the diegetic references in the music-but that hardly matters. (Diegetic means sounds-including music-occurring within the context of the story that the characters could hear.) There's no mistaking the Moroccan setting, or the complicated feelings toward the French Resistance through a constantly shifting La Marseillaise, or the terror we feel when the dark Germanic music overtakes the sweetly nostalgic pub song "As Time Goes By." You can hear it as Max Steiner's brilliant score ends with a powerful depiction of the relentless persistence of hope in the face of darkness, even if you don't know how the story ends. In fact, given that this film was released three years before the end of World War II, Steiner himself didn't even know how the full story would end-nor did the rest of the world. But the music, as always, makes his position clear.

Thank you for joining us this evening, and let the magic begin!


