In this, our first tour in over a decade, members of EYSO's flagship Youth Symphony bring you sparkling wit and humor, spectacular power and majesty, heartfelt emotion and pathos—and all with the excellence and artistry that is the hallmark of EYSO. Whether you're a long-time listener or joining us for the first time this evening, we can't wait to share our stories with you.

All season long, EYSO musicians have explored how sound comes together through thoughtful design to make music—and how music can change the world. Together, we have examined how composers and artists build clear objectives and well-crafted blueprints, employ layers of meaning both conscious and subconscious, then utilize a steady hand to guide the process—and ultimately, how innovators shape the world around them. In Elgar's *Enigma Variations*, we studied how a simple but ever-changing theme can carry the weight of a masterpiece, while in Respighi's *Pines of Rome*, we learned how to create images—light and dark, vibrant and placid—from pure sound. In these and so many other works performed this year, the intentionality of design has been a powerful through-line that helped bring our performances to life as we explored what makes each piece tick.

With these final concerts of the year, we take inspiration from both this season's theme— *Design*—as well two foundational cities in American and world history, New York City and Boston, to bring repertoire both new and old to the stage. From operatic overtures inspired by and premiered in New York to works in homage to our founding fathers and our shared national tragedy in 2001, these pieces connect different threads of American history through craftsmanship and artistry. And, of course, no concert featuring impactful music from New York and Boston could be complete without Leonard Bernstein's timeless *West Side Story*, one of the most impactful works of art of the 20<sup>th</sup> century.

Orchestral music is unique in that the design is often separated from the execution. Much as an architect may draft designs while a contractor brings them to the physical world, composers build the blueprints that performers—like the young artists on-stage today—must explore, interrogate, and ultimately realize in the sonic realm. This takes more than blind obedience to what is on the page: it takes curiosity, wisdom, critical thinking, and a desire to be a part of creating something grander than one person. With their relentless enthusiasm, Youth Symphony students pour themselves into the music, bringing it to life with their own interpretation and unique vision.

Thank you for joining us today as we celebrate the work of these incredible young artists.
