Ladislav Sutnar (1897-1976) was a Czech graphic designer. He is considered to be a pioneer of information design and paved the way for modern informative graphics. Working in Prague in World War II, he taught at the State School of Graphic Arts and edited on the side. His works can be found in the Art Institute of Chicago, as well as MoMA and other galleries.

Beatrix Potter (1866-1943) was an English illustrator. Many children grew up reading her books, most notably *The Tale of Peter Rabbit*. Beatrix grew up drawing and sketching. It was one of her friends who suggested she should write children's books after receiving a particularly beautiful letter. Although her art may not circulate in art museums, it is beloved by families and children everywhere.

Stephanie Sinclair (b. 1973) is an American human rights photographer. Her work has spanned from gender inequality to domestic life in developing countries to the Iraq war. Much of her focus now is on forced and child marriage in different cultures. You can find her works online, in *National Geographic*, and in top galleries in Europe.

Nam June Paik (1932-2006) was a Korean videographer. He is said to be the founder of video art. He worked in close coordination with cellist Charlotte Moorman as well as other collaborations with John Cage, Merce Cunningham, and Joseph Bryce. You can see his work in the Smithsonian Museum of Art.

Nick Park (b. 1958) is a name you may recognize from the popular titles *Wallace & Gromit*, *Chicken Run*, and *Shaun the Sheep*. This stop-motion animator made a name for himself working with Aardman Animations on many of their popular films, TV shows, and shorts. The English artist is still making stop-motion to this day, currently working on a *Wallace & Gromit* TV series.
